Activities:

Basketball History Booklet - Inside the book, write about the history of basketball.

How Many Players Lift the Flap Book - Under each tab, answer the questions about basketball.

Offense / Defense Lift the Flap Book - Under each tab, describe what a team is doing when it plays offense or defense.

Court Labeling - Label the basketball court's parts. You can also draw in the different players in their proper positions.

Positions Fan Booklet - On each fan page, describe the duties of one of the positions on a basketball team.

Basketball Moves Index Cards - On each card, explain the move indicated on its tab.


Referee layered book - Explain each item on the layered book.

Leagues circle fan - Write about the different basketball leagues.


Stars Envelope - Make biography squares for each of your favorite players. You can include their photo as well as important information about each. Place these cards inside the envelope.



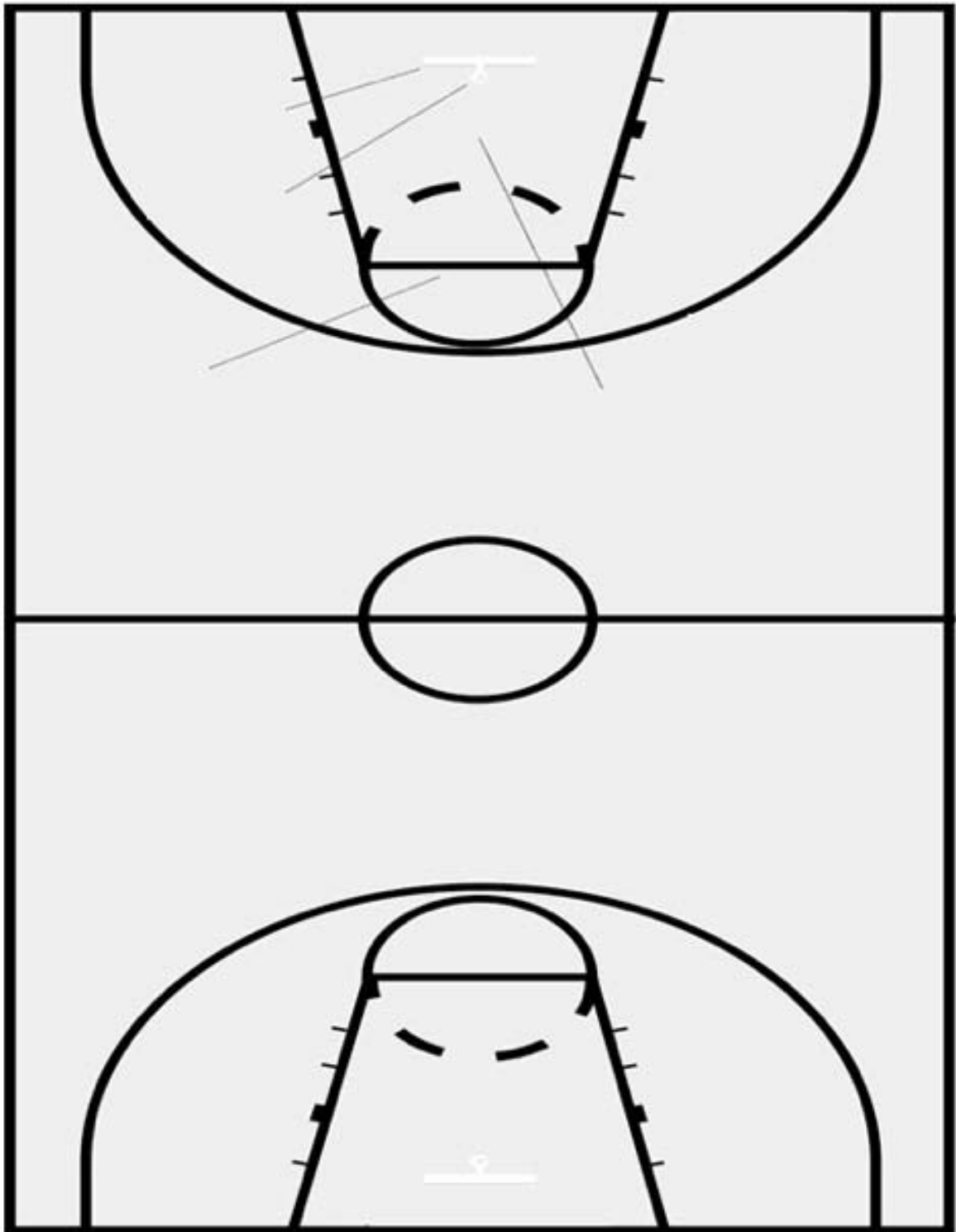
Cut out along outside lines. Fold on dotted line, so text is to the outside. On the inside, write about the history of basketball

Cut out along solid lines. Fold on dotted line so the text is on the outside. Open up each flap to answer the questions.

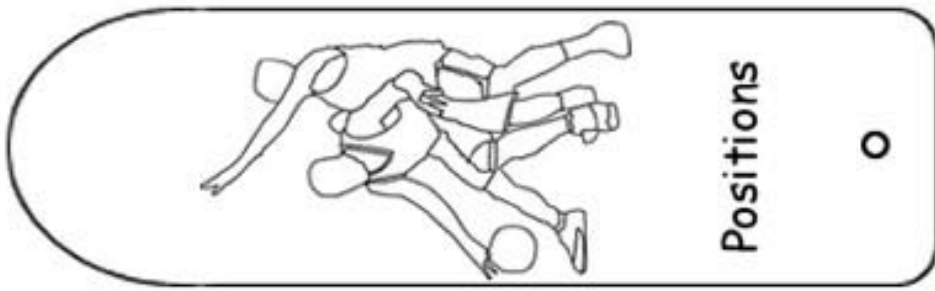
Offense	Defense
	

Cut along solid lines. Fold on dotted line so writing is to the outside. Inside each flap, explain what a team is doing when it is playing offense or defense.



Cut out court and label parts including:

sideline	free throw line
baseline	free throw lane
midcourt line	basket
three point line	backboard



Positions



Cut out all shapes and punch holes in each on the small circles.

Stack them up and fasten them together with a brass fastener. They will now be like a fan. On each one, write about one of the positions on a basketball team.

Dribble

Pass

Shoot

Rebound

Guard

Cut out each index card. Layer them on top of each other and staple them together at the bottom. On the card draw a picture or explain each basketball move.

Cut out all boxes along solid outer lines. Stack them together with the biggest on the bottom and the smallest on top. You will be able to see the bottom text on each one.

On the top page, describe a referee's job in the game.

On the next page, explain what it means to be a non-contact sport. On the following page, explain traveling. On the bottom page, explain when free throws are given and how they work.

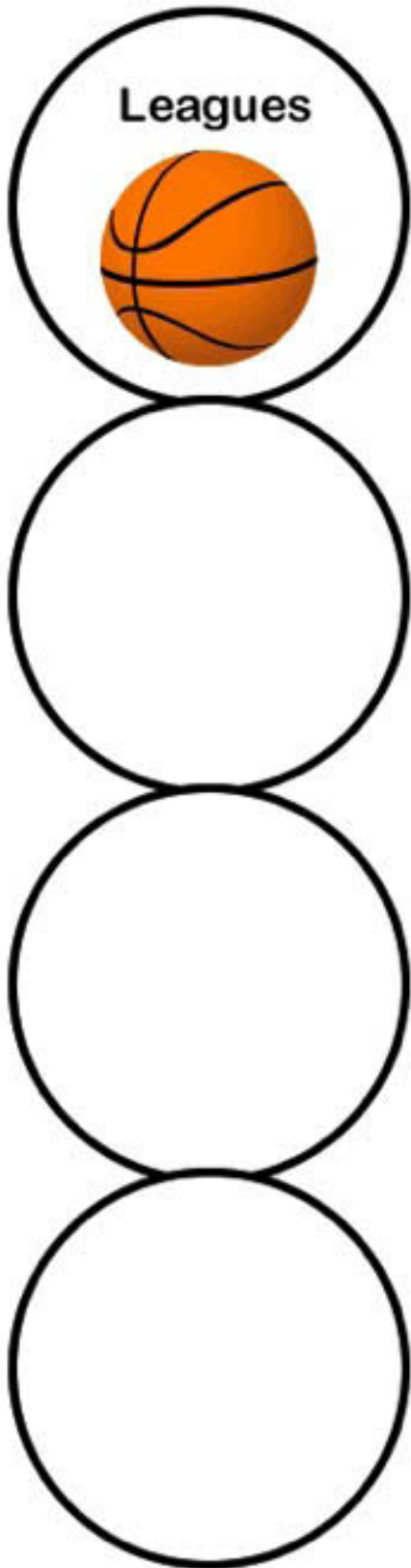

Cut along the outer edges. Fold with a fan fold leaving the basketball on the outside. Inside, describe the different basketball leagues.

Cut out along outside lines. Fold on dotted lines, so text is to the outside. Glue the flaps onto your lapbook. Cut out 6x6 inch squares. On each square, write about one of your favorite basketball stars. Place inside envelope.
