Activities:

The Ball Book - Write about the size and material of a soccer ball.

Soccer Lift the Flap Book - Answer the questions about the game of soccer.

Soccer Field Shutter Book - Decorate the outside and label the items on the field.

The Goalkeeper Matchbook - Write about the job of a goalkeeper.

Soccer Moves Envelope - You can use this envelope to describe and illustrate soccer moves as you learn how to do them.

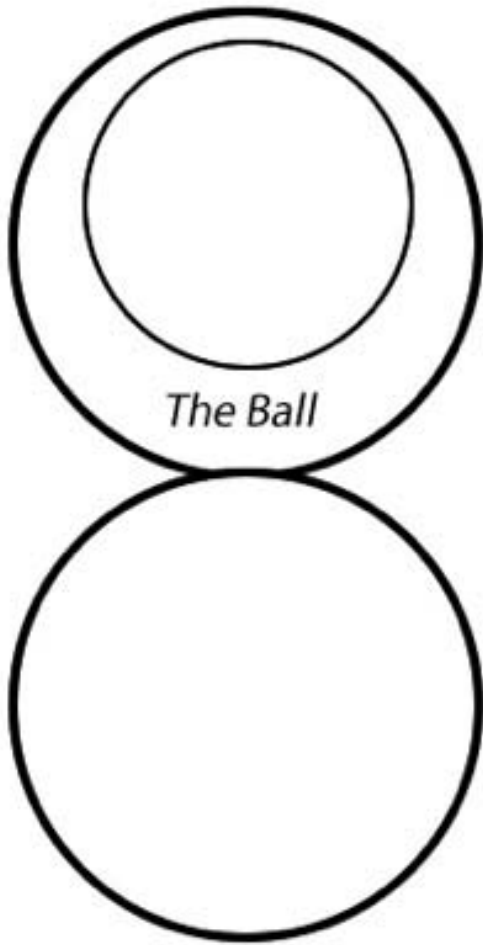
The Players Layered Book - Describe the roles of each type of player.

The Referee Book - Write about the referee's job in a game of soccer.

History of Soccer Book - Write a brief history of the game of soccer.

Soccer Superstars Index Book - Choose your favorite five soccer superstars and write about one on each index card.

World Cup Envelope Book - Write about the World Cup games in this book.



Cut along the outer edges. Fold in half, leaving the writing on the outside. Color the ball so it looks like a soccer ball. On the inside, write about soccer balls - their sizes, their material, etc.

	What is the soccer field called?
	What is a soccer game called?
	How long is the game?
	How many players per team?

Cut out along solid lines. Fold on dotted line so the text is on the outside. Open up each flap to answer the questions.



The Goalkeeper

Cut out along outside lines. Fold on dotted lines, so picture is to the outside. Flap the text over the top like a matchbook. Inside, write about the goalkeeper.

Soccer Moves



Cut out along outside lines. Fold on dotted lines, so text is to the outside. Glue the flaps onto your lapbook. Cut out 6x6 inch squares.

On each square, describe and illustrate a different soccer move (kick, dribble, tackle, etc.) Place inside envelope.

The Players



Forwards

Midfielders

Cut out all boxes along solid outer lines. Stack them together with the biggest on the bottom and the smallest on top. You will be able to see the bottom text on each one. On each page, describe the players' roles.

This is what the finished book should look like.

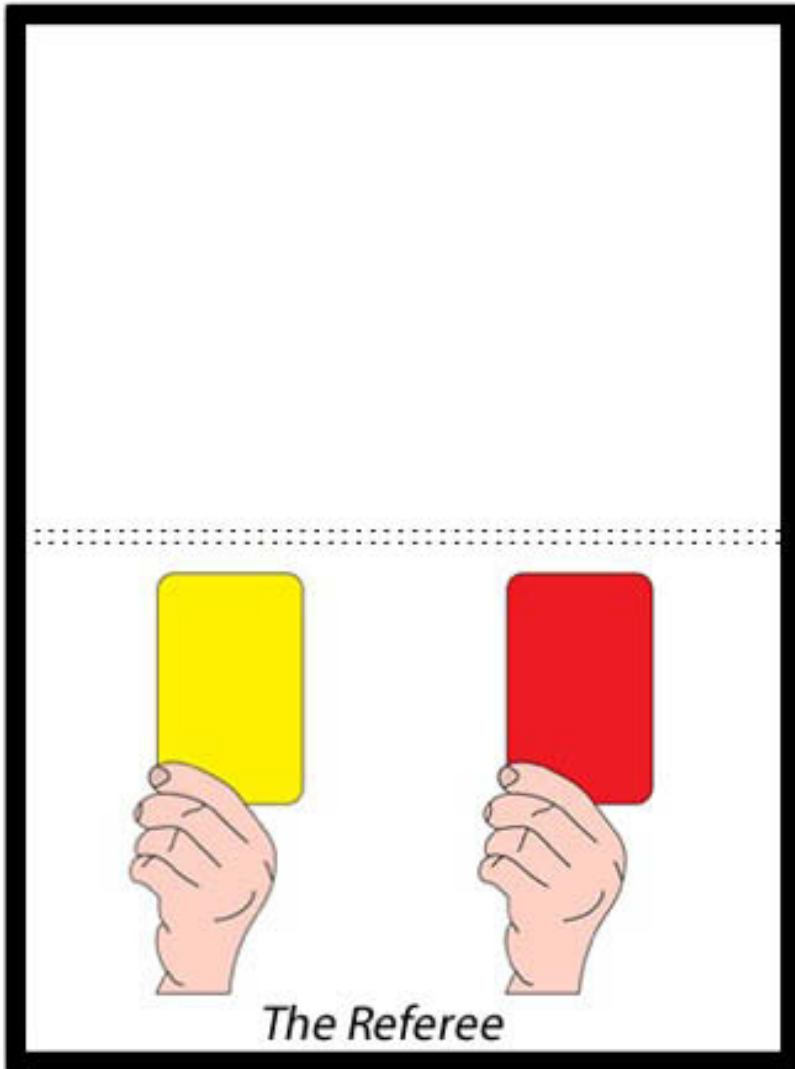

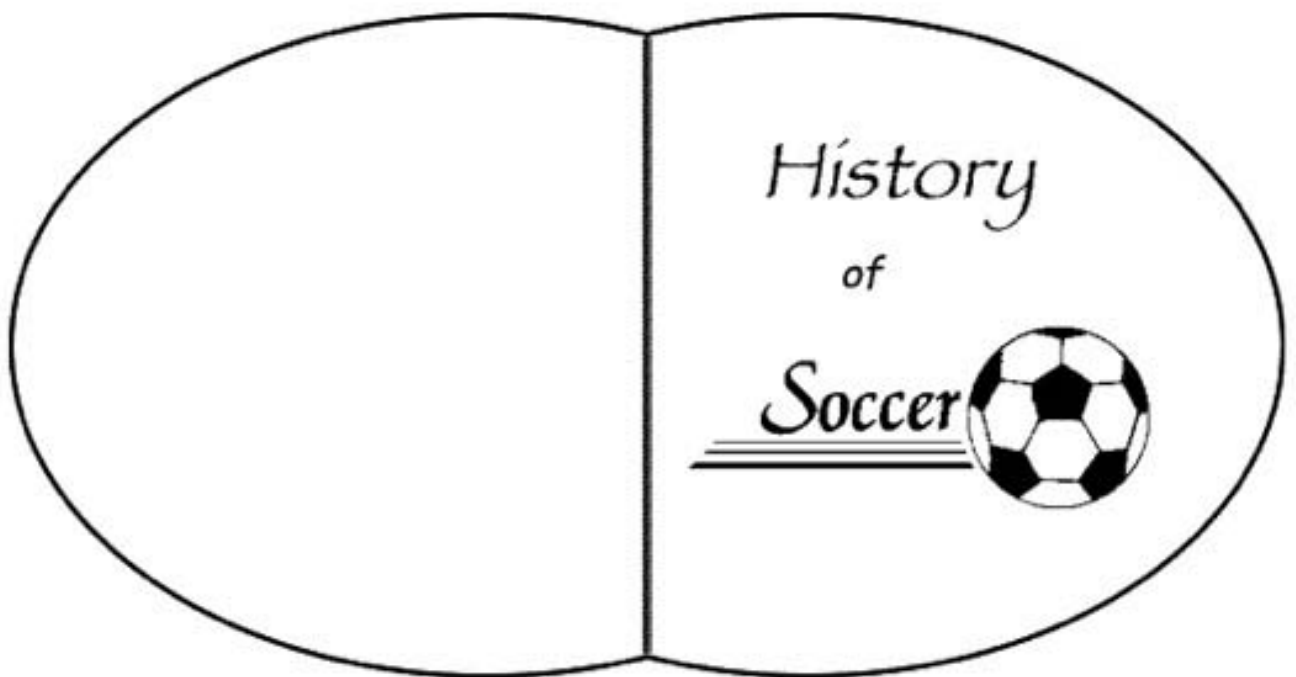
Forwards

Midfielders

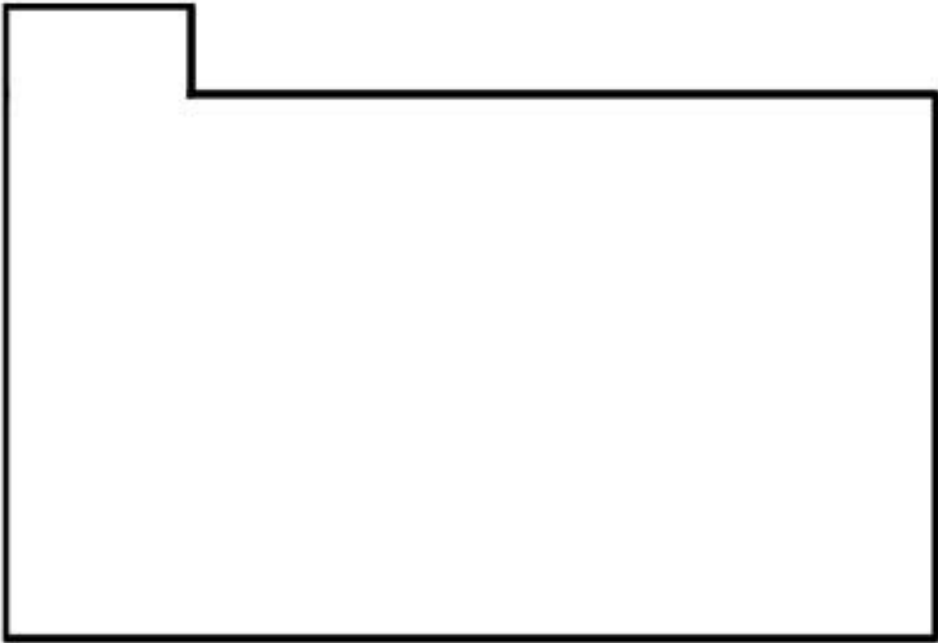
Defenders



Cut out along outside lines. Fold on dotted line, so text is to the outside. On the inside, write about the referee in soccer.

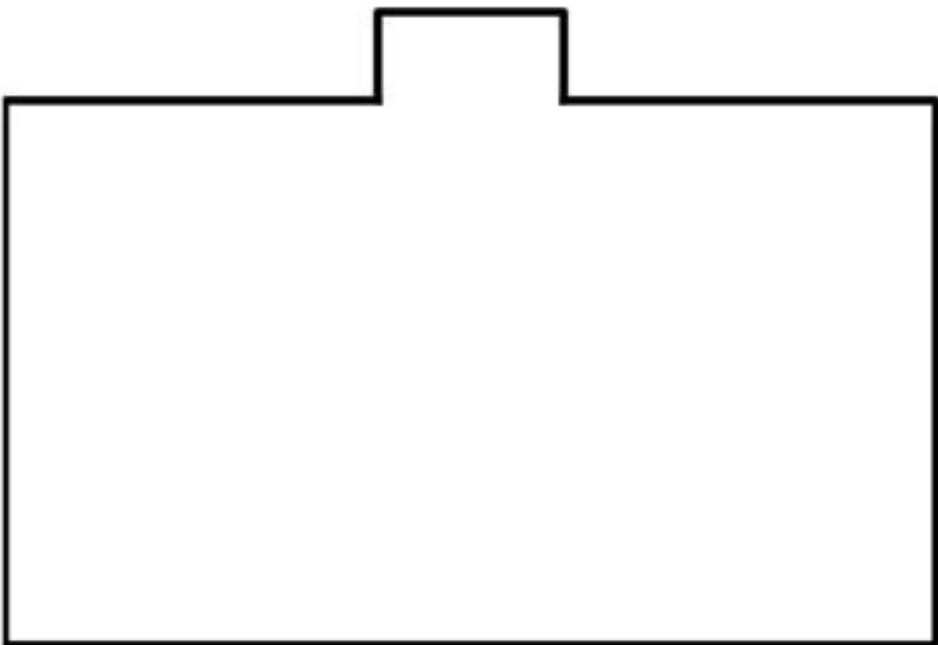
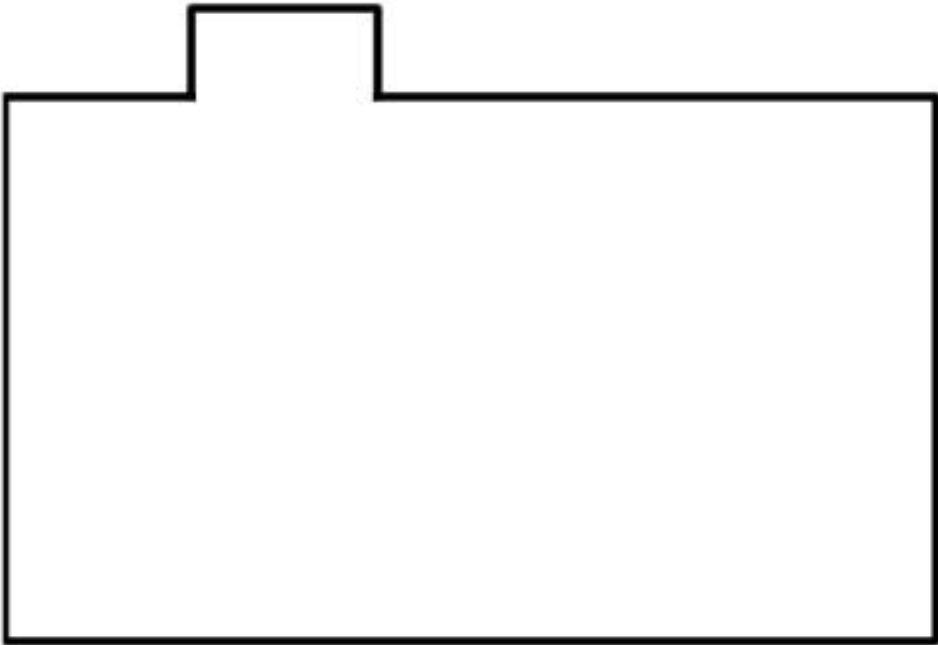


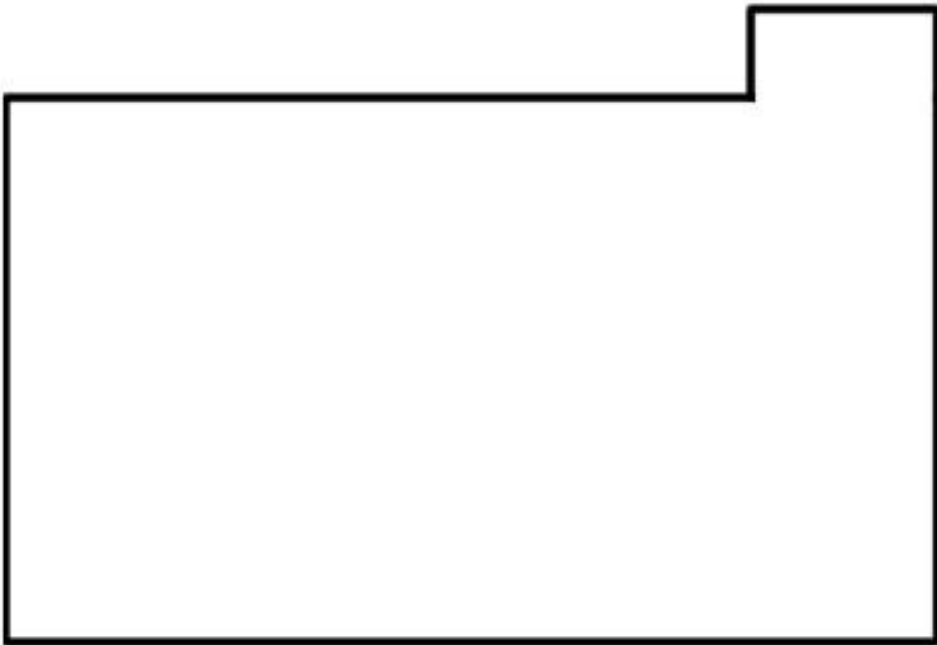
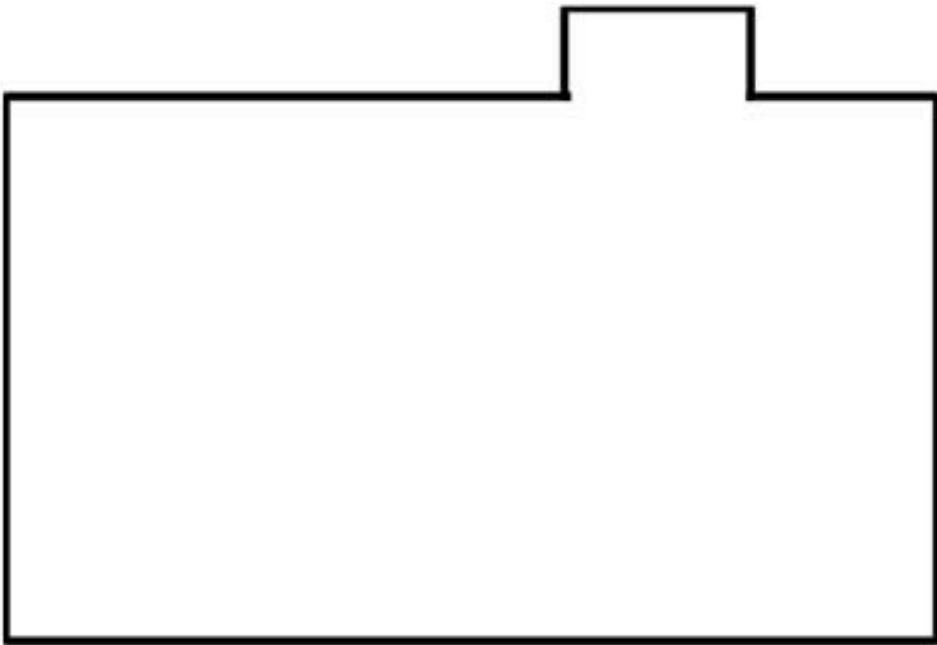
Cut out along outer edges. Fold in half. Inside, write about the history of soccer.

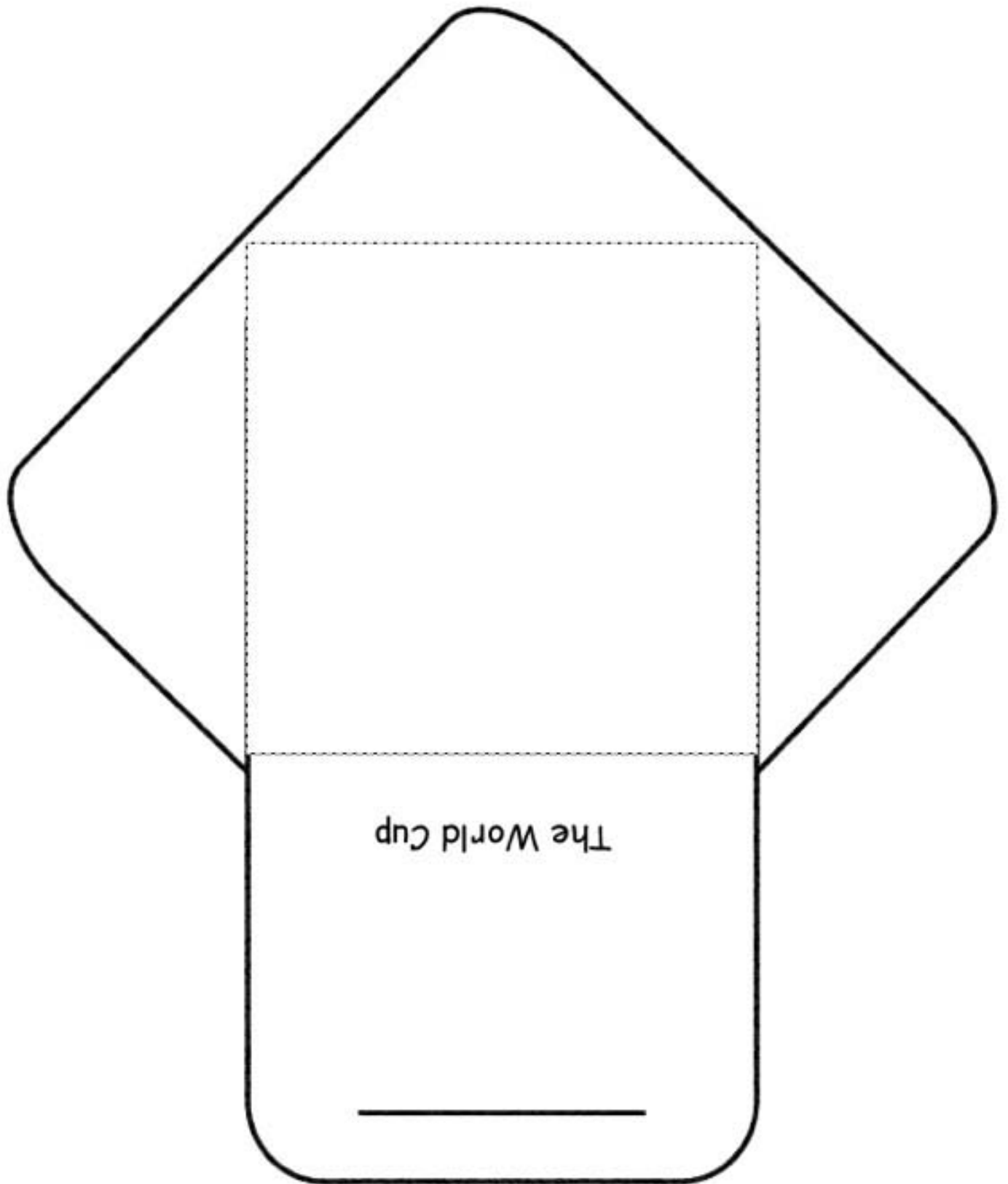


Soccer Superstars

Cut out these index cards and staple together at the bottom. On each one, write about a soccer superstar.







Cut out on outside line. Cut out thick slot. With lines facing down, fold up on each dotted line. Tuck corner into slot. On the inside, write about the World Cup.
